Safety

The safety of our students is paramount here at Sarah Redfern PS. The beginning and end of the school day are very busy times and we all need to work together to ensure the safety of our students. Please remember that there is no parking in our **kiss and drop zone**. This area is for dropping off students only.

It is important to supervise your children when they are **riding a bike** until they are at least 10 years old. Until children are at least 10 years old they should ride away from vehicles and driveways. As they are learning to ride it is important to ride or walk alongside them.

Children under 12 and adult riders accompanying and supervising them may ride on the footpath, unless there are signs specifically prohibiting cycling.

Please ensure that your child wears a helmet if riding a bike to school.

To ensure student safety please let your child's teacher know details about how your child travels home daily. This is important as teachers will allow students only to leave the school grounds on the conditions outlined by parents and carers. In this way we can work in partnership to provide increased safety for our students.

Front Office Information

Payments

Our office hours are 8.30am to 3.15pm. We only take payments up until 10.30 a.m. Mornings are our busiest time. To alleviate the need for parents to be waiting for a lengthy amount of time to pay fees etc we would ask that you take into consideration the following.

POP (Parent Online Payment)

The preferred method of payment of any school fees/excursions etc is via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. Payments can be made using either a Visa or Mastercard credit or debit card. The payment page will be accessed through the front page of our website by selecting "Make a Payment" tab. This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit/debit card details are captured in a secure manner, these details are not passed back to the school.

Items that can be paid include general contributions, excursions, sales to students and any other extracurricular activities. Payment for an activity or excursion does not constitute permission to participate. Permission slips are still required for all activities/excursions by the nominated due date. If your payment is not received by 6 pm on the due date, your payment will be refunded back to you.

When making an online payment, you must enter the student's name (as stated on their Birth Certificate) and date of birth. These details are entered each time you make a payment as student information is not held within the payment system. You will also have the option to enter in a Student Reference Number (SRN) as well as an invoice number. You must also enter details about who is paying. No student details are given to Westpac. As a consequence, payments for each student must be made separately.

Under the payment options, you enter the activity or item for which you are paying. Write a title in the payment description (e.g. Year 6 Camp, Stage 3 Party Day, Athletics Carnival, School Hat). This will enable the office staff to identify and match your payment with the account or any other separate payment that has been requested. Multiple items can be made in one transaction for each student. If you have received a "Statement of Account" and wish to pay the total, you may list this as "Full payment of Statement of Account" in the *Other* field, without having to list each item individually.

You have the ability to check and change any details of the payment before the payment is processed. Receipts can be emailed and/or printed by you.

Details of payments are passed daily to the school where they will be receipted against the student's account. As a receipt has been issued from the payment page, a further receipt will not be issued by the school.

Please note, payments must be made by 6.00pm to show on the school's account the next working day. Payments made after that time will appear two days later

We hope this method will streamline payments and save parents time.

EFTPOS

We also accept payments at the front office via EFTPOS. Acceptable methods of payment with cards are savings, cheque, credit, tap & go. This is not a cash out facility and we are unable to refund any payments made via EFTPOS. Refunds will be processed via a school cheque if approved.

As we will incur merchant fees, a minimum payment of \$10.00 is required to use EFTPOS.

We accept payments at the front office between the hours of 8.30am and 10.30am, at which time our daily banking reports are completed and closed off.

Cash

THE CORRECT AMOUNT must be placed into an envelope with the permission note and sealed and placed in the secure box outside the admin block as this alleviates the need to enter the office area and eases congestion.

Please make sure that you have your child's name (as stated on their Birth Certificate), their class and the payment details



written on the front of the envelope. Once the payment has been receipted, a receipt will be sent to your child's teacher for them to hand to the student.

Please note that we have a cut-off date for payment of school excursions etc. Late payments will NOT be accepted unless prior arrangements have been made with the office.

Seven new school zone traffic offences

To help schools keep the school zone safer for all pedestrians and drivers there are seven new traffic infringements with new fines. None of the seven offences attract demerit points when committed elsewhere on the road but in a school zone they each come with two points.

The changes are:

- 1. Stopping in intersection Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- 2. Stop within 20m of intersection (traffic lights) Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- 3. Stop within 10m of intersection (no traffic lights) Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- 4. Stop near bicycle crossing lights Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- 5. Obstruct access to ramp/path/passageway Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$330 and 2 demerit points.
- 6. Not parallel park in the direction of travel Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a \$330 fine and 2 demerit points.
- 7. Parallel park close to dividing line Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a \$330 fine and 2 demerit points.
