Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a busy but settled start to Term 3! Our current procedures remain in place around COVID-19 and the NSW Department of Education continues to communicate updates to guidelines which have been implemented in our school. The key message is to keep focusing on good personal hygiene practices and physical distancing whenever we can. An important change in the guidelines, as directed by the Department of Education, is that if students have been sent home from school, or are absent from school due to flu-like symptoms, you are strongly encouraged to have your child COVID tested. The school will need to sight the negative COVID test results before allowing your child to return to school. We continue to live in very unpredictable times, and I will keep you informed if anything else changes.

Preschool News

Group 2 preschool children found an Earthworm that had been hiding underneath our plastic shapes. "Where has it come from?" Miss Kmet asked. The children responded with "It came from the dirt and it's a snake!". Miss Kmet explained to the children that this animal was called a worm and it helps our soil by squiggling down underneath the grass and it came out of the dirt because of all the rain that we had. Miss Kmet looked up the body parts of a worm. We found its head, its stomach (which was a big red ring around its body) and its bottom. Following this, the children found a slug in the garden. We watched the slug as it sat on top of the soil. Through these the children were learning about the world in which they live in, looking at life cycles and how insects help our garden and our earth – (Outcome 2, EYLF.) For Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children's Day, the preschool children learned a new game with the Year 5/6 students from the big school. The preschool children had to line up in groups of three and had a turn at throwing a small bean bag into the hula hoop (target). They made sure they were using their sharing skills and gross motor skills of over-arm throwing. The older students that came down to assist us, told us about the game, "kalkadoon kee'an" (pronounced 'kal-ka-doon kee-an'). The game came from the Aboriginal people of North Queensland called the Kalkadoon people. We thank the older children and Miss Waddell for teaching us this wonderful game and sharing their time and knowledge!

Year 1 News

1B have been focusing on problem solving in math's over the past few weeks. We have been learning to find important words in math's problems that give us clues about how to complete the problem, and to draw the story to get our answer. We are even learning some ways that kids in other countries solve problems, to see what works best for us. We are getting super clever at solving math's problems! During our learning in mathematics the students have been developing their skills in identifying and naming two-dimensional (2D) shapes. Additionally, they have been learning to recognise the attributes of each 2D shape, for example, the number of sides or corners (vertices). The students have been participating in various activities to help them learn about a range of shapes. Some of these activities were manipulating 2D shapes to create a picture (with a partner), songs, tracing around shapes, finding shapes in the classroom environment and making a shape monster. The students have been engaged with their learning and would love you to see their shape monsters.
